Predict

Determine what you think will happen next in the text.

Use the title, the text you have read, and illustrations to help you.

Predictions can change as you read!

Visualise

Create mental images of the settings, characters and events in the text.

Use what you already know and have read to help you.

Visualising creates pictures in your mind!

Question

Stop and ask yourself questions to see if the text makes sense.

Reread the text if you need more information.

Connect

Think about what you already know about the text.

Find ways to relate the text to yourself, other

texts read and the world around you.

Connections build understanding as you read!

Identify

Determine the author's purpose.

Find the important details, the main idea and the themes of the text.

Infer

Use the clues in the text and your own knowledge to fill in the gaps.
