Determine what you think will happen next in the text.

Use the title, the text you have read, and illustrations to help you.

Predictions can change as you read!

I wonder if ...

Visualise

Create mental images of the settings, characters and events in the text.

Use what you already know and have read to help you.

Visualising creates pictures in your mind!

Stop and ask yourself
questions to see if the
text makes sense.

Think about what you

Identify

Determine the author's
purpose.

Find the important
details, the main idea
and the themes of the

Use the clues in the text
