Practice writing numbers 0 – 50. Make sure you have the digits in the correct place and the right way around.



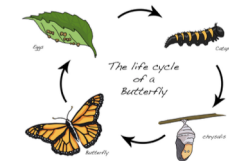
English

After the Great fire of London, the city had to be rebuilt. Draw and label a new design for the city. Explain how you will make sure it doesn't burn down again.



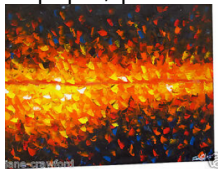
Science – life-cycles
