

Please ensure you set up access as this will provide all the information you need for events in school, information, daily updates on what the children are learning and gives you a direct way to message your child's teacher.

Significant learning moments and events are recorded on Tapestry, it is also a way you can share with us anything you do at home and how home learning will be set.



Preparing your child for Nursery

The School Day

At Copperfield Academy we provide all day sessions (8.30-3.15pm) and morning sessions (8.30-11.30am)

8.30am Gates open for all children. Early morning activities

8.40am Gates are closed and the register is taken in class. Children tidy away their early morning activities and get ready to start the day.

12.40pm Group Activity time

12.50pm Innovate learning (Child Initiated learning time)

2.30pm Group activity time and story time

3.00pm Song time and Getting ready for home

3.15pm Home time



The School Day

Morning Procedure

Children enter through the Early Years gate (On Park Avenue) from 8.30am each morning. The gate is open until 8.45am. There is a member of the Early Years team to welcome your child in from the gate each morning. Children wave goodbye to their adult at the gate and line up with the class LSA. We support children with this routine, you will find they quickly adapt and are keen to be first in the line.

Collecting your child

At the end of the school day, you will enter the playground through the Year 1 and 2 gate on Park Avenue, wait behind the cone for your child and exit the playground through the EYFS Gate. If someone different is picking up your child, you must inform your child's teacher or the school office. If we have not been informed, we will not release your child.

If your child attends morning sessions, they will exit Nursery from the Year 1 and 2 gate. All gates will be clearly signposted to support you finding them.

School Dinners

Children in Nursery can have either a packed lunch or a school dinner. In Nursery school dinners are chargeable, at a cost of £2.25 a day. If you decide to provide a packed lunch, here are some suggestions for what to put in:

Milk and Fruit

Every child under the age of 5 is entitled to free school milk. Please visit the www.coolmilk.com website for more information. Children are offered a piece of fresh fruit each day during snack time. They also are offered a drink of water or milk. If your child has any allergies, please ensure you inform us. Children have access to water all day.

Water Bottles

Children need to bring a water bottle to school every day. Bottles must only contain water; these can be refilled at school throughout the day.

How will my child learn?

Group learning time

Throughout the day your child will take part in group learning time. This is a time in the day where the learning is directed by an adult. Group learning time will focus on your child's next steps.

Early Phonics

At Copperfield Academy we teach Phonics from Nursery upwards using Read, Write, Inc Phonics, we start this in the Spring term at Nursery. Before children begin Read, Write, Inc sessions we play lots of Phonics games to develop our listening and attention skills and practice the skills of blending and segmenting.

Maths Learning

At Copperfield Academy we use a mastery approach to deepen children's understanding of mathematical concepts and ideas. We teach short Maths sessions each day where we teach new skills and deepen children's mathematical thinking and understanding. This is included in our group learning time.

Innovate Learning

Innovate time is magical in our classrooms. This is the time where children will apply the skills they have been taught in an independent way. Each week activities will be themed around our text of the week; children are able to engage in a variety of activities. Adults are on hand to scaffold, guide, and challenge children's learning. Innovate learning allows children to become independent and resilient learners.



Storytime

At Copperfield Academy we love to read! Reading is at the heart of everything we do. We read stories every day and have a dedicated story time each day. We also have our own school library.

Forest Schools

We are incredibly fortunate to have our own woodlands on site at Copperfield. We visit the woodlands each week and use the natural environment to enhance our learning.

Transition into Copperfield Academy

Date	Session	Content
Thursday 8th June	Welcome Meeting	Welcome meeting to introduce staff members, to tell you more about what to expect from your child's first year and answer your questions. Children are not expected to attend this session.
Thursday 15th June 3.30pm	Stay and play with parents	Come and see your new environment with parent/carers (siblings also welcome)
Friday 30th June 9.30am- 10.30am	Stay and Play	Come and play in your new classrooms (no parent/carers to stay)
Wednesday 5th July 2-3pm	Stay and Play	Another opportunity to play in the new classroom setting, children will be leave with a social story with photos of their new setting and teachers to look at over the summer.
Friday 1st September 12pm-1.30pm	Open Day Family Session	Arrive at 12pm to visit the classroom, collect any uniform orders and answer any questions you may have.
Tuesday 5th September	First Day!	It's time for your child's first day at Nursery!



Home Visits at Copperfield

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Every year we visit every new member of our Early Years at home and complete home visits. The chance to get to know you and your child more is invaluable. Home Visits will be completed between 3rd July until 7th July. You will receive a home visit time at the welcome meeting, if you are unable to make this appointment please email jemma.lane@copperfieldacademy.org where we will do our best to rearrange. At these sessions your child's class teacher and another member of the EYFS Team will attend.

Nursery Visits (if your child has attended a pre-school setting prior to our Nursery)

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Alongside home visits we often visit children in their Nursery setting for them to become more familiar with us in an environment they are comfortable with. These visits will take place during this term at school, we will contact your child's current Nursery to arrange a suitable time to visit. If you have not already told us where they attend, please do share this information with us so we are able to go and meet them.



Nursery Funding

15 hours funded space.

The term after your child's third birthday entitles them to 15 hours free childcare. At Copperfield this is offered through morning provision from 8.30am-11.30am Monday to Friday.

30 hours funded space.

After securing your 30-hour code, you must ensure you renew every 3 months. You will receive email reminders to do this, if you do not renew your code, then you may be charged for the cost of the terms Nursery fees. Our suggestion is your add to your calendar or phones calendar the renewal dates so you do not forget.

Additional Hours

If you wish to pay for additional hours in addition to the government's universal free 15 hours of childcare to 30 hours but do not qualify for a 30 hour code you can do so by paying for an extra 15 hours per week. The cost of this is £75 a week. Tax Free Childcare can also support towards the cost of childcare, for every £8 paid by you, the government will add £2 towards Nursery fees. Uniform

Purple sweatshirt, cardigan, or fleece (If you would like a school logo sweatshirt then these are available to order from school office)

White Polo Shirt

Black jogging bottoms/black leggings

Black shoes with Velcro fastening.

Black shorts (jogging bottoms in Winter), white t-shirt and plimsolls or trainers

Spare change of clothes

Grey skirt or pinafore dress

On PE days please send your child in a black tracksuit with white t-shirt. In the summer they may wear black shorts. Trainers or plimsolls are also needed.

We also ask for wellington boots to stay in school all year round, alongside a waterproof coat.

Toilet Training

For lots of children they may be beginning their Nursery journey already potty trained. For others they may be in the process of potty training and for some they may not be ready just yet. No matter what stage your child is at in their potty-training journey, we will support their development. We ask if your child is still in nappies, you send in nappies and wet wipes in their bag. If your child is potty training, please ensure you have provided plenty or spare clothes and if your child is already potty trained, please ensure we have a spare pair of clothes, just in case!
